The following license conditions apply to the usage of the data:

The Commission is authorised to use the geographic data as follows:

- As geographic reference, i.e., creating a geographical context for other data,
- For the production of maps, publications, posters, presentations and statistical analysis,

- For deriving new geographic datasets by applying data manipulation procedures, e.g., combining different geographic datasets, generalisation procedures including smoothing and dropping of spatial features, adding new attribute information. Examples of derived geographic data are the NUTS map or the Trans European Transport Network.
- For distributing the geographic data within the Commission as well as to the public in the form of publications, posters, presentations, derived analysed statistical data and derived geographic datasets.
