Transparency	Clear documentation of PAMs related information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Detailed description of PAMs (objectives, scope, legal basis) - Public consultations and online availability of plans and reports
Accuracy	Use of reliable data and determined methodologies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Application of IPCC/EU-recommended methods - Use of official statistics and verified administrative data - Cross-checks and expert review by LEGMC, involved institutions and ministries
Consistency	Uniformity across time, sectors, and reporting instruments	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Harmonized templates for all reporting - Consistent models/assumptions with national inventory and NECP
Comparability	Alignment with international standards to allow comparisons across countries	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Sector classification aligned with IPCC and EU systems - Use of common units (e.g., kt CO₂ eq.) - Alignment with EEA/UNFCCC reporting guidelines - Participation in EU-level working groups
Completeness	Full sectoral, gas, and policy coverage, including overlaps and updates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Inclusion of all sectors and gases - Coverage of both implemented and planned PAMs (WEM and WAM scenario) - Identification of overlapping measures - Regular updates via NECP and progress reports
